Over 5,000 Infants Safely Relinquished Across the U.S. Under Safe Haven Laws April is Safe Haven Awareness Month Across the US

GLENDALE, Ariz.— More than 5,000 infants have been safely surrendered across the United States since the introduction of Safe Haven laws in 1999, according to data compiled by the National Safe Haven Alliance, a nonprofit that supports parents and providers, promotes the laws, and provides education to the community.

These laws, enacted in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, and the US Virgin Islands, allow parents to relinquish unharmed newborns anonymously at designated locations such as hospitals, police stations, and fire stations without fear of legal repercussions. Originally established to prevent infant abandonment and infanticide, Safe Haven laws have contributed to a 13% reduction in overall infant homicide rates since their nationwide adoption. The CDC reports a nearly 67% decrease in homicides occurring on the day of birth, highlighting the laws' effectiveness in providing safe alternatives for parents in crisis. Despite these successes, the utilization of Safe Haven laws varies significantly across states. For instance, Texas has recorded 252 surrenders since 2009, with 21 in 2020 alone. In Iowa, 76 infants have been surrendered since the law's enactment over two decades ago.
