

BABIES SAVING BABIES CAMPAIGN

The National Safe Haven Alliance (NSHA) is partnering with adoption agencies across the county to directly impact the lives of infants who may otherwise be illegally abandoned without the Safe Haven law and NSHA.

Through NSHA's Babies Saving Babies Campaign, this initiative provides a direct opportunity to impact the lives of babies that have been or may be relinquished under the Safe Haven law. Each year countless lives are lost due to infant abandonment and infanticide and you now have the ability to change this reality.

In partnership with adoption agencies across the nation, NSHA has established the Babies Saving Babies Campaign urging adopting families to make a donation to NSHA in the name of their adopted child or children!

WHO ARE WE?

For more than 15 years, the National Safe Haven Alliance (NSHA) has been committed to educating and promoting the various Safe Haven Laws across the United States. First enacted in 1999 by the state of Texas, the Safe Haven Law, known as the Baby Moses Law in Texas, was established to allow parents to safely surrender their unharmed infant to a designated Safe Haven provider within a state's specific amount of time. The age limit and providers vary among the states, but hospitals are a designated provider in every state. Since the first enactment in 1999, all U.S. states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico have established a Safe Haven Law and more than 4,000 infants have been safely relinquished to Safe Haven locations across the nation.

WHAT DO WE DO?

As a 501(c)(3) organization established to provide oversight and support to all states, the mission of NSHA is to prevent and end infant abandonment across the country. By providing training and leadership for all Safe Haven providers as well as connecting with Safe Families, adoption agencies and crisis pregnancy organizations across the country, NSHA is using best practices in conjunction with the law that each state provides. Although the specific laws may vary by state, the consistent theme is that a mother or parent that may be unwilling or unable to care for their baby may relinquish an unharmed infant to a specified Safe Haven provider regardless of their geographic location.

PUTTING YOUR DOLLARS TO WORK

24/7 CRISIS HOTLINE

NSHA operates a 24/7 Crisis Hotline operated by a trained Crisis Intervention Team consisting of social workers, nurses and first responders. Your donations help us maintain the Crisis Hotline and sure our team is given the highest level of training.

PROVIDER TRAINING

NSHA is based in the state of Arizona, but provides Safe Haven training to designated Safe Haven providers across the country. Your donations are used to provide free training sessions for fire stations, hospitals, and many other Safe Haven providers.

KEEPING MOTHERS & INFANTS TOGETHER

In an effort to keep infants with their mothers, NSHA operates a program that provides in-kind and financial assistance to mothers who may otherwise resort to abandoning or surrendering their infant. This often looks like the donation of diapers, infant clothing & supplies.
